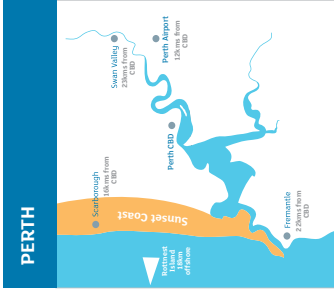

Cottesloe, Scarborough and the Sunset Coast

Cottesloe is home to one of Western Australia's most iconic beachside venues, Indiana, formerly the Indiana Tea House. Indiana, built in 1910, sits alongside another iconic property, The Cottesloe Beach Hotel, which first opened its doors in 1905 and now boasts a sophisticated Beach Club catering for up to 840 guests.

Further north is Scarborough, home to the largest coastal hotel in Perth, the Rendezvous Hotel Perth Scarborough, a 4.5-star beachfront hotel overlooking the ocean. Scarborough, like many locations in and around Perth, is being revitalised. Backed by the State Government and the City of Stirling, the redevelopment project aims to create one of Australia's best beachfront destinations. The Metropolitan Redevelopment Authority plans to create a vibrant hub of activity with new restaurants, cafes, shops and entertainment with a range of event and activity spaces.

In addition to the 336 rooms and suites at the Rendezvous Hotel Perth Scarborough, the sunset strip stretching from Cottesloe to Two Rocks offers a range of accommodation plus nonhotel venues with unique spaces ranging in size from 200 to 2000 guests (cocktail format). These include limestone caves, sporting venues, aquariums and function spaces with marina views.

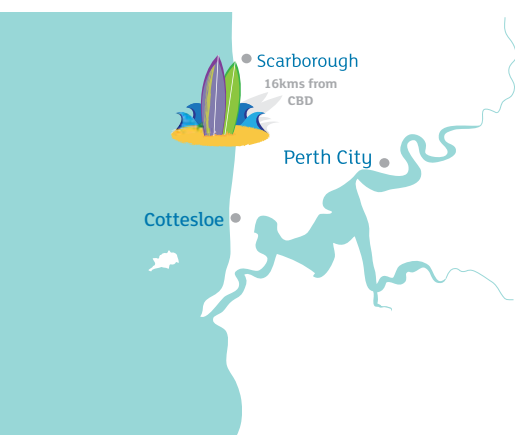

Fremantle

Just 20km south of Perth is the port city of Fremantle, voted by Lonely Planet as one of the top 10 cities to visit in the world for 2016. 'Freo' is famed for its rich cultural heritage, lively entertainment spots, maritime links and alfresco lifestyle. Over 150 buildings in the port city are classified by the National Trust, recognising Freo as the best preserved 19th century seaport city in the world.

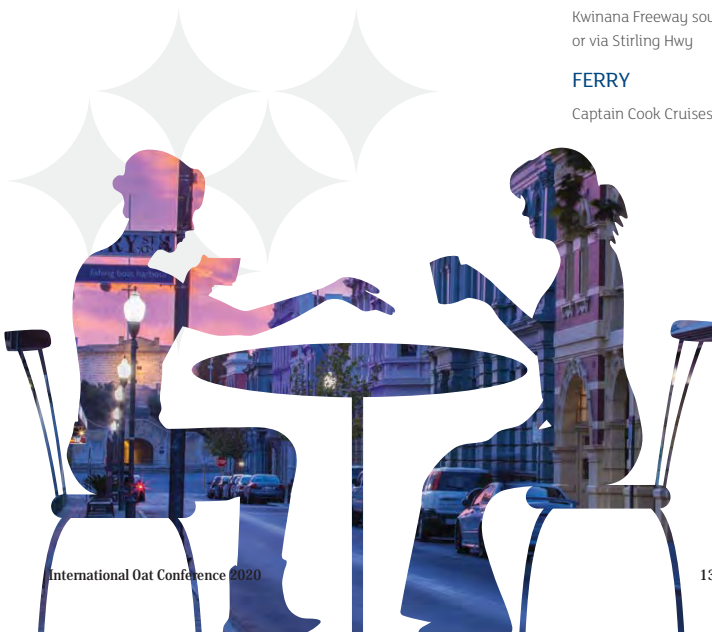

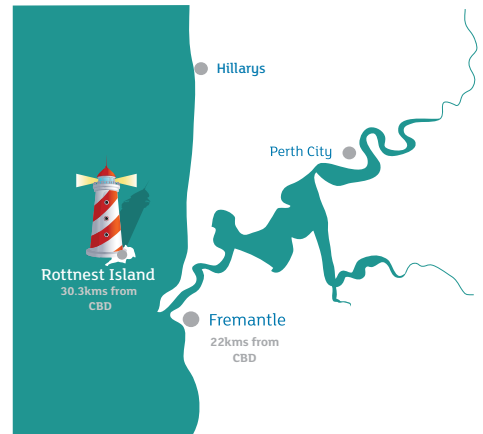

The South West

Western Australia's South West is the only region in the world that has award-winning wineries, world-class surf breaks, majestic ancient caves and old-growth, tall-timber forests. It is a biodiversity hot spot with 80% of plant species found nowhere else on the planet. It is stunningly beautiful and has an incredible energy that has to be experienced to fully understand its magic.

The heart of the South West is Margaret River, a 'must do' destination for visitors. It is popular all year round offering leisure, adventure and luxurious indulgence.

The region produces less than 3% of Australia's overall wine production but 20% of the nation's premium wine. Where there's good wine, there's good food and Margaret River is a case in point.

Attractions and experiences in the South West:

- Indulge and rejuvenate with a relaxing spa treatment in a tranquil forest setting.
- Paddle a canoe up Margaret River on a Bushtucker Tour.
- Discover the world's oldest living culture with an Aboriginal cultural experience in an ancient cave.
- Walk the rugged coastline of the Cape to Cape Trail or a serene forest walk, or step it up a notch with a mountain bike ride on the Munda Biddi Trail through unspoilt forest and bushland.
- Visit Busselton, a very pretty seaside town famous for its 1.8km long wooden jetty and Underwater Observatory.
- Visit Walpole, a country town with the fantastic Valley of the Giants Tree Top Walk.
- Visit Augusta, a small coastal town where the Indian Ocean meets the South Ocean. This is one of the best places to experience a whale watching tour.

Getting there

Bunbury is only 1.5 hours south of Perth by road.

Busselton is a further 45 minutes by road from Bunbury.

Margaret River is just 30 minutes from Busselton, or three hours from Perth by road.

You can fly to Margaret River from Perth in approximately one hour.
